Great ShakeOut draws closer

Californians will join millions of people worldwide as they "Drop, Cover and Hold On" at 10:17 a.m. Thursday during the 2013 Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills.

The Great ShakeOut is an annual event for people in homes, schools and organizations to practice earthquake safety and preparedness.

The earthquake drills are also meant to encourage people to review and update their emergency preparedness strategies and equipment and to secure their space to avoid damage and injuries.

So far, 9.4 million participants in California are registered for Thursday's drills.

Some Orange County participants include Cal State Fullerton, Chapman University, UC Irvine and other local campuses, the County of Orange, local governments and businesses, school districts and other organizations.

Because the County of Orange has 25 departments and agencies and about 16,000 employees, each agency will decide what earthquake safety method works best, said Howard Sutter, County Executive Office public information officer.

"We encourage employees to have a place in the office where they can take cover that will provide protection from items that may fall rather than trying to evacuate from the building," said Sutter.

Cal State Fullerton started its earthquake awareness activities Tuesday with the "Quake Cottage" simulator that allowed riders to experience an 8.0 earthquake in a specially designed


