RECORD 10 MILLION + TO PARTICIPATE IN GREAT CALIFORNIA SHAKEOUT

Major Events Planned in Bay Area and Southern California, Remembering Loma Prieta 25

WHO: More than 10 million Californians (25.2 million worldwide), a record total, will participate in

schools, businesses, government agencies, organizations, communities, and homes, more than ever before. ShakeOut drills are organized in 47 states and U.S. territories as well as several

other countries (see www.ShakeOut.org).

WHAT: Great Shakeout Earthquake Drills are annual opportunities for millions of people throughout

California and around the world to improve their earthquake safety.

WHEN: Most participants hold their ShakeOut drill on Thursday, 10/16 at 10:16 a.m.

WHY: Everyone, everywhere should know how to protect themselves during earthquakes. Even if

earthquakes are rare where you live, they may happen where you travel. The recent South Napa Earthquake, the 20th anniversary of the '94 Northridge earthquake this past year, and the upcoming 25th anniversary of the '89 Loma Prieta earthquake (10/17) are critical reminders that

this is Earthquake Country.
