"Earthquakes strike at any time with no warning," reminds Mark Benthien, communications director, Southern California Earthquake Center. "Knowing how to protect ourselves means being trained to immediately and instinctively 'Drop, Cover and Hold On.' It also means having enough food and water to last for at least three days when public services are disabled. I urge every business, school, organization and individual to register, participate, and be prepared so you can be the next survival story."

On August 23, 2011, a 5.8 magnitude earthquake near Richmond, Va. sent shockwaves up the East Coast including New England. Although the Commonwealth emerged unscathed, the earthquake served as a wakeup call for the region. In response, Blue Cod Technologies has registered as an official 2011 Great California ShakeOut site to share information on how to better prepare, protect and recover from an earthquake.

"As an East Coast company, Blue Cod Technologies has a unique connection to helping improve earthquake protection for Californians from an insurance-coverage perspective," said Simon de Montfort Walker, executive vice president, operations, Blue Cod Technologies, Inc.
