WASHINGTON, DC, EVENTS HIGHLIGHT 26 MILLION PEOPLE PARTICIPATING IN "GREAT SHAKEOUT" DRILLS WORLDWIDE IN 2014

WHY: Everyone, everywhere should know how to protect themselves during earthquakes. Even if

earthquakes are rare where you live, they may happen where you travel, so it's important to

know and practice what to do to be safe.

WHAT: Great Shakeout Earthquake Drills are annual opportunities for everyone, everywhere to practice

WHO: A record number of more than 25.6 million worldwide (as of 10/15) will participate in schools,

businesses, government agencies, organizations, communities, and homes, in 47 states and U.S. territories, across Canada and Japan, and in more than 45 other countries (see

www.ShakeOut.org for participating regions and up-to-date totals).

WHEN: Most participants hold their ShakeOut drill on Thursday, 10/16 at 10:16 a.m. (the "International

ShakeOut Day of Action"). Drills can also be registered any day through the end of the year.

KEY VENUES: Washington National Cathedral: Media availability and live interviews, 5:30 AM to 9 AM.
